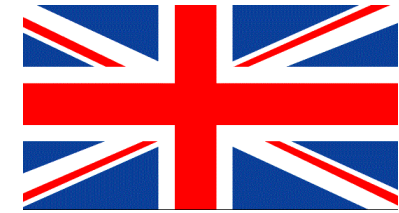




Great British Icons
