Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2015/2016

Information for Parents/Carers

The Pupil Premium is a government initiative that is primarily aimed at Reception to Year 11 pupils who are from low income families and are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM).

The Post-LAC (adopted from care) eligibility has changed. The DFE have removed the condition that eligibility for the grant is only for pupils adopted after 31 December 2005. Now all adopted from care pupils are deemed eligible for the grant.

The confirmed per pupil allocation for Pupil Premium for 2015-16 is

- £1320 for Primary Aged FSM Ever 6 pupils,
- £935 for Secondary Aged FSM Ever 6 pupils,
- £300 per Ever 5 Service Children pupils and
- £1,900 for Post-Looked After Children (adopted from care) pupils.

Schools are expected to use the funding to **help close attainment gaps** for eligible pupils.

60% of pupils being supported in Maths and Literacy are working at national expected level.
