# What is the Foundation Stage?

The Foundation Stage marks the beginning of your child's learning journey, starting in Nursery and continuing through to Reception.


At this stage, children learn best through play, exploration, and active engagement. Our approach encourages them to take part in a variety of fun and hands-on activities—some led by adults, others guided with support, and many initiated by the children themselves.

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Framework, which sets out how and what your child will be learning. The framework is designed to be flexible, allowing us to tailor experiences to suit each child's unique needs and interests, helping them grow with confidence and curiosity.







# **Our Learning Environment**

In addition to daily phonics and math's sessions, our learning environment is thoughtfully designed to support your child's development across all areas of the curriculum while nurturing their individual interests.



# Ready to Start? Building Independence and Social Skills

You can help your child feel confident and excited about starting school by encouraging the following skills at home:

- Talk positively about school Build enthusiasm by sharing what a fun and exciting place school will be.
- **Practise getting dressed** Encourage your child to have a go at putting on their own coat, shoes, and uniform.
- Use the toilet independently Help them build confidence in managing their own personal care.
- Take turns and share Learning to take turns and cope with not always winning is a big step in developing social skills.
- Ask for help Let them know it's okay to speak up when they need something.
- Keep trying Encourage perseverance, even when things feel tricky.
- Sit and listen Practice short moments of listening during stories or conversations.
- Have a go! Support your child in trying new things, even if they're unsure at first.

These early steps go a long way in helping children settle into school life happily and successfully.

#### SeeSaw

This is one of the ways we share what your child has been learning at school.

We use photographs and videos to observe, celebrate, and assess each child's learning and development.

Parents have access to these observations and can view their child's progress.



You are also encouraged to contribute by adding your own photos, comments, or examples of your child's learning at home. It's a wonderful way to build a strong home—school partnership.

#### What to wear

- Sky blue polo shirt
- Royal blue sweatshirt /cardigan
- The preferred colour for school trousers, shorts, pinafore dresses and skirts is navy blue.
- P.E. plimsolls, navy shorts and a royal blue t –shirt with school emblem
- Label all clothing including P.E kit!
- Your child will also need a draw string P.E bag.
- A warm weatherproof coat is essential in the colder weather as we will go outside every day!
- A pair of wellies that can stay in school.
- A book bag has been kindly donated by the PTA. You will receive it on the evening visits to school.

#### **School Lunches**

#### Packed Lunch or Hot Dinners?

- All children from Reception to Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal each day.
- Our school dinners offer healthy choices, with at least two meal options available daily.
- Menus are published on our school website so you can see what's on offer each week.
- Each morning, the class teacher will support children in choosing their meal to help make the process easy and enjoyable.

#### **Food and Drink in School**

Please send your child to school each day with a **named water bottle filled** with fresh water. A bottle with a sports cap is ideal, as it's easy for children to use independently. They'll have access to their water throughout the day to help them stay hydrated.

Fruit is provided daily, but you are also welcome to send in one healthy snack for your child to enjoy during morning break.



## **Allergy Awareness**

We are a nut-aware school, and the safety of all our children is very important to us. Please do not send any snacks or packed lunch items that contain nuts or nut products, as we have children with severe allergies.

We appreciate your support in helping us maintain a safe environment for everyone.



# **Medical Conditions and Allergies**

Please let us know about **any allergies**, **food intolerances**, **or medical conditions** your child may have.

This helps us **ensure their safety** and provide the best possible care during the school day.



# Starting School In September

We are committed to making your child's transition into school as smooth, positive, and enjoyable as possible. To support this, we take time to get to know each child and help them become comfortable with the school environment. This includes opportunities to meet staff before the September start.

Below, you'll find important information about key dates and events to help your child settle in confidently.

#### **Visiting Current Provision**

Our EYFS staff will visit your child's current nursery or preschool to meet them in their familiar setting and speak with their key adults. This helps us understand your child's needs and interests before they join us.



#### **Parent and Child Visit**

Once the school day is over and the site is calm, we warmly invite you and your child to visit the school together. This gives your child a chance to explore the environment in a relaxed atmosphere.

### **Stay and Play Afternoon**

We invite half the class at a time to spend a fun and engaging afternoon at school. This gives your child the chance to play, meet new friends, and become familiar with their new classroom.

Please bring your child to the school via the KS2 playground gate, where a member of staff will be there to welcome them.

#### **The First Few Weeks**

In September, we help children settle in smoothly by dividing the class into two smaller groups of 15. This gentle approach allows each child to feel more comfortable, gives our staff the chance to get to know them individually, and makes those first days less overwhelming.
